Toward an intersectional understanding of alcohol use among LGBTQ+ people of color.

<u>Summary</u>: Expanding on prior research, this study examined how discrimination based on race, sexual orientation, and transgender status affect harmful and hazardous drinking among LGBTQ+ people of color. Aims to examine the interactive effects of emotional dysregulation and psychological distress as mediators in the risk pathway.

<u>Duties</u>: (From conception to dissemination) Conducted literature searches, wrote grant proposal, devised study methodology. Will recruit a community sample, analyze results using SPSS, and report the results in the form of a thesis and poster.

Efficacy of a Modified Brief DBT-A Program in a School-based Setting Summary: Examined the efficacy of a modified version of a Dialectical Behavior Therapy for Adolescents (DBT-A) intervention program in a high school setting. Aimed to increase emotional regulation and reduce risky behavior, such as substance use.

<u>Duties</u>: Co-lead a 9-week, modified DBT-A intervention in a 9th grade classroom for adolescents with impulsivity and emotion regulation problems, attended supervision and didactic trainings, administered a survey battery that included clinical and behavioral questionnaires from participants in the intervention and control groups, scored measures and entered data in SPSS, conducted semi-structured qualitative post-group interviews with participants, thematically coded interviews.

## Gender Identity and Drinking Survey

<u>Summary</u>: Examined how different items used to assess sex, gender identity, and related constructs (e.g., masculinity-femininity) are related to alcohol consumption (quantity and frequency), alcohol-related consequences, and cognitions related to alcohol-related decision making (expectancies, motives). As the existing literature in this area has traditionally focused on binary assessments of sex and gender., research is needed into the impact of how alternative metrics of gender (non-binary, continuum approaches) relate to self-reported alcohol consumption patterns.

<u>Duties</u>: Constructed Qualtrics survey, helped with IRB submission.

## A Meta-Analytic Review of Dieting Behaviors

<u>Summary</u>: This meta-analysis attempts to define dieting behavior by examining the concept of unhealthy weight loss practices among adolescents under 18 in the US, who do not have a diagnosed eating disorder.

<u>Duties</u>: Coded 95 studies as part of the analysis, will help with writing and editing of manuscript.

## Stress, Trauma, and Health Survey

<u>Summary</u>: Examined how stress and trauma, particularly based on the experiences of those belonging to marginalized groups, related to various physical and mental health outcomes, such as healthy eating and substance use among a university student population.

<u>Duties</u>: Helped design codebook, conducted literature searches, submitted IRB proposal, constructed Qualtrics survey, modified measure instructions and format where appropriate.
